

Rules for Industrial Arts - Mr. Murphy

1. Safety First! All of the rules that follow flow from the first.
2. Respect. Treat everyone and everything with respect.
3. Responsibility. Be responsible for you *and* your environment.
4. Productivity. Be productive at all times.
5. When students walk in the door, they should already be familiar with and following the general rules for Giles School. These are in addition to those in the student handbook and are unique to Industrial Arts.
6. Students must provide their own safety eyewear and should bring in protective clothing (aprons or smocks).
7. In order to use the power tools, the 7th and 8th graders must wear shoes that cover their feet and are secure. No flip-flops, clogs or sandals. I suggest gym shoes or any type of shoe that covers the foot and laces or buckles.
8. No gum.
9. No horseplay or running. Goofing off can result in the loss of your access to the tools and if you can't work on your projects, you can't pass the class.
10. Follow precisely all instruction with regard to the tools and equipment in the shop. Tools are not toys and using them improperly can result in the loss of your access to the tools and if you can't work on your projects, you can't pass the class.
11. Report any accident or injury to the teacher immediately.
12. Make sure clothing and hair are out of harms way. Pull hair back, roll up sleeves and remove dangling jewelry and watches.
13. Specific tools and situations will generate rules and procedures unique to that circumstance. Follow those instructions as given.
14. Craftsmanship and attention to detail in all efforts.
15. And last, see rule one.
